“We want to highlight excellence, both by celebrating leadership and sharing tangible evidence so others can benefit from their work,” says Karen Cator, CEO of Digital Promise.

“There’s also a kind of magic involved with bringing together three critical communities — teachers, administrators and organizations that are building tools and services,” says Betsy Corcoran, cofounder and CEO of EdSurge. “Each of these groups are learning from — and teaching — one another.”

There are five awards each for three categories of leaders: teachers, administrators, and organizations (both for-profit companies and nonprofit organizations). The **“Creative Director” award for teachers**, for instance, spotlights teachers who are inspiring their students to create high-quality multimedia projects. The **Administrator “Open Door Policy” Award** will elevate administrators leading the way in collaboration, communication, and sharing their schools’ practices with others. And for organizations, the **“Mindful Data” Award** will celebrate a company or nonprofit that has exemplary data management policies.

People and organizations can nominate themselves or others for the awards. All applicants are asked to create a short video illustrating their practice. EdSurge and Digital Promise are convening a team of respected educators and thought leaders who will review the videos and pick the most compelling practices. Among the judges are:

“The most significant award, however, is that the work will be shared widely as examples of great practices,” Corcoran says. “There are marvelous practices out there and we’re looking forward to publishing them.”
