Big Idea: Micro-credentials and professional learning recognition structures

Essential Question: How might micro-credentials be included in professional learning recognition structures?

Challenge Statement: Identify the design of systems that recognize micro-credentials in professional learning recognition structures.

Guiding Questions

What do we need to know to solve this challenge?

- How can we promote and message multiple currencies so it's not narrowly limited to CEUs?
- What stakeholders need to be part of the discussions, decisions, information sharing and potential policy changes?
- Do MCs earned from different organizations have the same level of rigor? Should there be varying levels of recognition?

Guiding Activities

How will we answer our questions?

- Define rigor; develop a common language - which includes rigor and authentic learning
- Curate examples and promising practices of states, districts, and schools that demonstrate the shifts in the five categories.
- Analyze the promising practices, develop recommendations, and share in a toolkit based upon these examples, which could lead to a toolkit.

Solution

What is a solution to our challenge?

- Convene a working group of key stakeholders (content experts, evaluators, issuers, users/educators, etc.) to verify a universal set of valid, reliable, research-based standards for transferrable micro-credentials.
- Build a Toolkit on Critical Systems Shifts for MCs (mindset, professional learning and support, roles and incentives, infrastructure/technology, and policies)
- Seek philanthropic / foundation funding to build a community of practice for educators and administrators pursuing MCs
