

34 Schools Nationwide Join Verizon Innovative Learning

Continued partnership between Digital Promise and Verizon provides free technology, internet access, and professional development to select Title 1 middle and high schools

March 4, 2024 | **Washington, D.C.** – Digital Promise and Verizon today announced that 34 Title 1 middle and high schools from 13 districts across the country will join the <u>Verizon Innovative</u> <u>Learning Schools</u> program in the fall. Through the continued partnership between Digital Promise and Verizon, the Verizon Innovative Learning Schools program works side-by-side with schools and districts to get internet-connected devices into the hands of students and to enhance how teachers use technology in the classroom with dedicated coaches, professional development, and community building with an ultimate goal of achieving sustainable digital equity throughout the school district.

The 11th cohort expands the program's reach to 626 schools in 115 school districts across 39 states and Washington, D.C.

Title I schools with a 65 percent or higher free and reduced-price lunch population are eligible for the program; however, 78 percent of students in this cohort of Verizon Innovative Learning Schools qualify for free and reduced-price lunch.

"We are proud to continue our partnership with Verizon for the Verizon Innovative Learning Schools program," said Jean-Claude Brizard, president and CEO of Digital Promise. "By bringing our combined strengths to this transformative program, Digital Promise and Verizon aim to advance digital equity and support students, teachers, and schools from historically and systematically excluded communities in unlocking the potential of technology to transform teaching and learning."

Participating schools receive free mobile devices (either tablets or laptops) with up to a four-year Verizon data plan for every student and teacher. Teachers gain access to extensive professional development that supports powerful teaching and learning with technology in and out of the classroom. In addition, these schools receive a subsidy toward a full-time technology coach to support teachers with effectively integrating technology into learning.

"Verizon Innovative Learning Schools goes beyond providing devices and connectivity, with robust support to meaningfully integrate technology into student learning," said Alex Servello, senior director of corporate social responsibility at Verizon. "We are grateful to extend our partnership with Digital Promise to include these 34 additional schools, and further expand upon Verizon's work to help close the digital divide."

As part of Verizon's commitment to digital inclusion under Citizen Verizon, the company's responsible business plan for economic, environmental, and social advancement, Verizon Innovative Learning is driving academic improvements. Eighty-two percent of Verizon Innovative Learning Schools teachers reported that the program helped them explore new ways of teaching, and 77 percent said the program enhanced student engagement.¹
