This Learning Map is your gateway to the full suite of professional growth opportunities for League district and school leaders. It is designed to help you identify experiences aligned with your goals, chart your development pathway, and connect deeply with peers facing similar challenges and opportunities.

Convenings

Convenings are the cornerstone of the League experience.

These immersive multi-day experiences combine site visits, member-led presentations, host district deep dives, facilitated debriefs, and networking receptions. They allow members to observe innovation in action, reflect strategically on district priorities, exchange insights with peers, and translate learning into actionable practices that drive change at home.



Ongoing Growth Support

Beyond convenings, the Learning Map highlights a variety of engagements that support ongoing growth:

- quarterly calls provide timely peer-to-peer reflection and dialogue;
- Learning Collaboratives enable members to dive deeply into shared challenges through cycles of inquiry and feedback;
- topical webinars keep members abreast of emerging trends;
- **implementation cohorts** support long-term, systems-level innovation;
- and direct participation in Digital Promise research projects and pilots allows members to test, refine, and contribute to evidence-based practices.

Consider this map your compass for navigating and maximizing every opportunity to learn, lead, and improve outcomes across your district. Each engagement is designed to strengthen connections, foster experimentation, and empower members to both contribute to and benefit from the collective knowledge of the League network.









How are annual League membership dues determined, and who can I contact with questions?

Annual dues are based on student enrollment and range from \$2,500 to \$4,000. For questions about dues, contact the League team at league@digitalpromise.org

When will our district receive the invoice, and when is payment due?

Invoices are issued in early October to the superintendent and the designated district billing contact. Payment is requested by the end of January to ensure uninterrupted membership benefits.
